#### **KAY FEURER**

Kay Feurer, former Executive Director of the SAAC, passed away on October 18, 2018. Kay was instrumental in the creation of First Night® Springfield and saw her dream of an arts center realized with the opening of the Hoogland Center for the Arts. She took great pride in helping everyone in the local art community thrive. Kay also served the Springfield area as a volunteer leader for ARC (now SPARC), the Springfield Ballet Company Board and the Allocation Panel of the United Way. She was a committee member of Lincoln Academy and a member of the American Symphony Orchestra League. She also served on the Board of Directors for the Illinois Art Alliance and the Illinois Alliance for Arts Education.






